At the Clough Colloquium, Pulitzer prize-winning author David McCullough talked about the importance of education and the teachers that we should hold in high esteem—a topic which certainly resonated with the students and the audience at large.

Jane Jacobs Lecture featured author and journalist Robert Self, who discussed the life of the first African-American mayor of Stockton, California, Willie Brown. Tubbs, who champions reforms to improve police community relations, increase investment in the underserved areas of Stockton, and other local initiatives, encouraged students to serve the communities in which they live, whether it be in public office or as entrepreneurs.

The Forum on Ethics featured Jacqueline Novogratz, CEO and founder of Acumen, a non-profit global investor in social impact. Her book, *The Blue Sweater: Bridging the Gap Between Rich and Poor in an Age of Global Inequality* (required reading for the incoming Carroll School freshmen) has also been a major focus of the Center's programming.

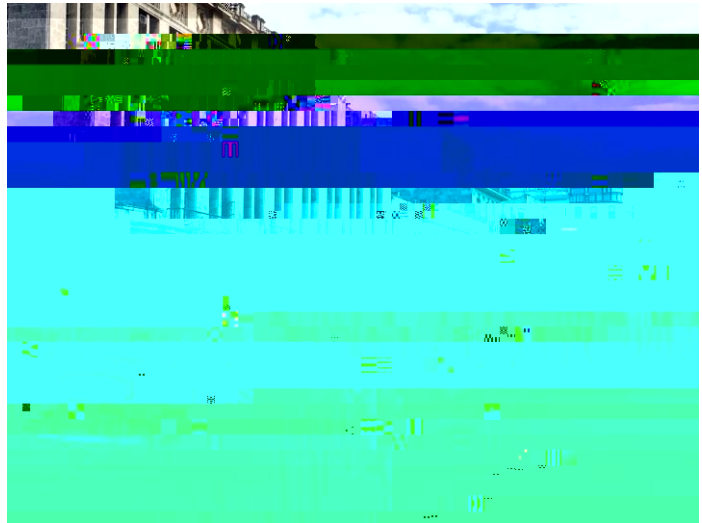
