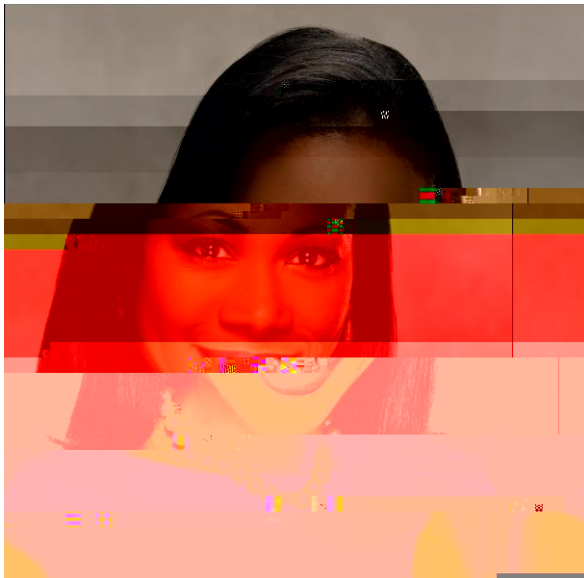
The featured a new play by Ron Jones, *HER INVESTMENT: A Story of Women, Color and Access to Capital*, which addressed the inequities of economic access in America.

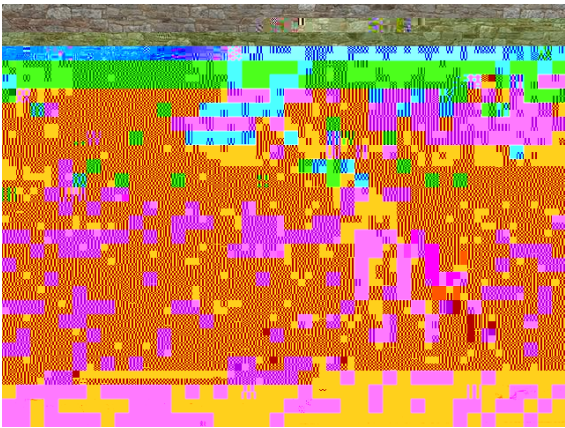
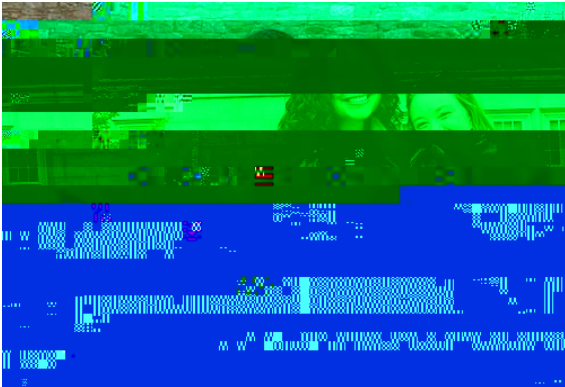

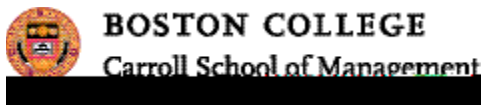
