Results:

Human Experience

- Over 91% of the students feel they have definitely or somewhat enhanced their awareness of the human experience and culture and that is up about 3 points from last year.
- o 100% of the students felt they definitely or somewhat gained knowledge of theater through history.
- o 98% felt they were introduced to theatrical methods of artistic expression.
- o 91% of the students said it definitely or somewhat enhanced their cultural awareness.

Theatrical craft and skills

- o Students overwhelming agreed that they were exposed to theater as an art form but have less confidence about their ability to discuss it intelligently.
- o They clearly understand its historical significance.
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
