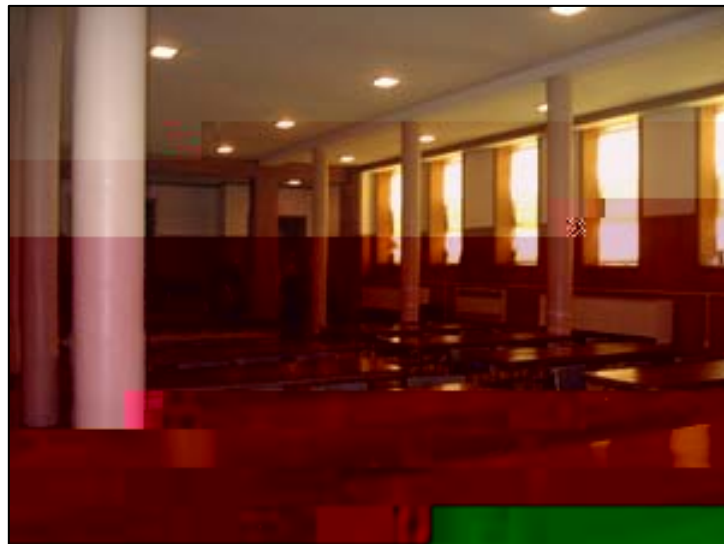
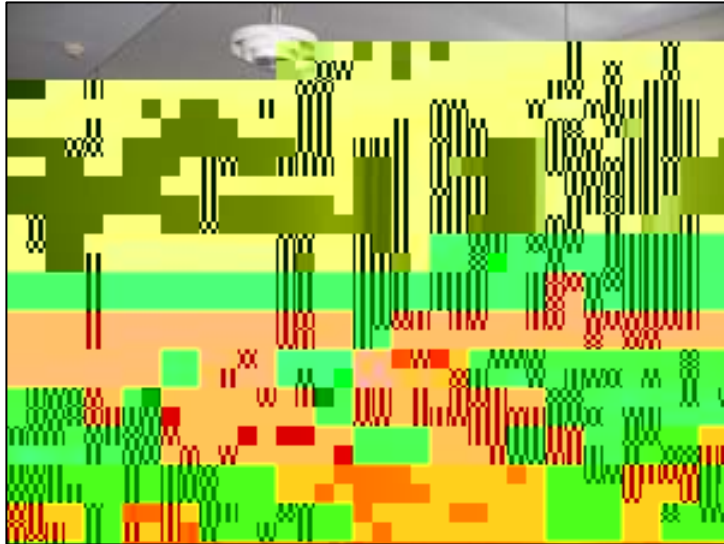

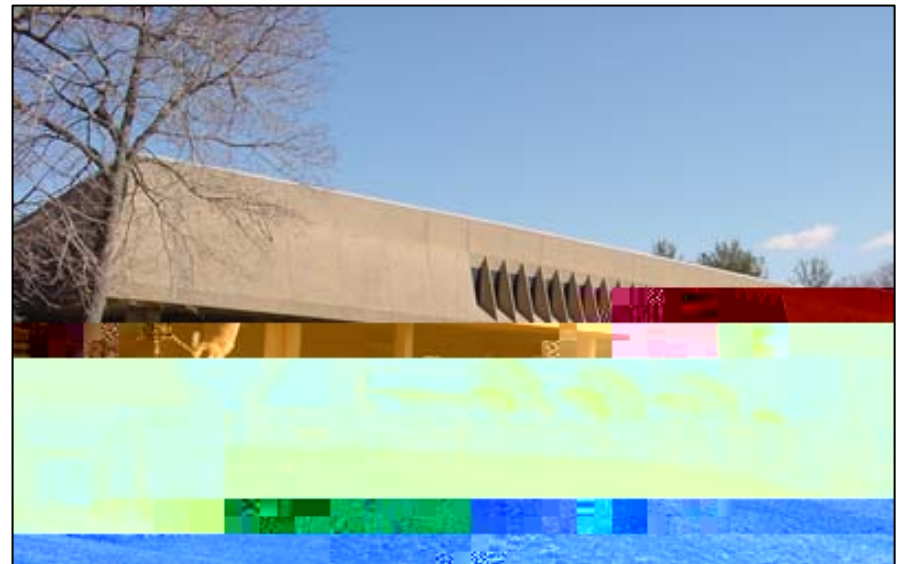


SAINT JOHN'S SEMINARY

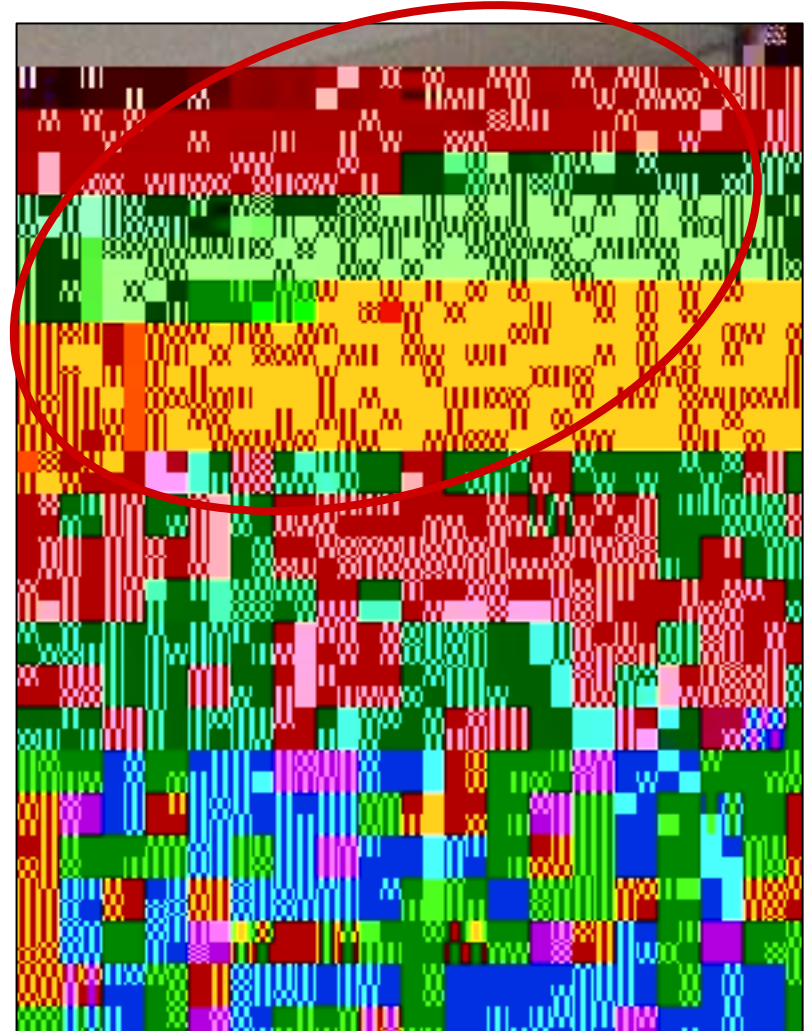
- ÿ Joint use by St. John's Seminary and BC School of Theology and Ministry

- ÿ Creating one of the largest and most comprehensive collections of Roman Catholic theological works in the U.S.



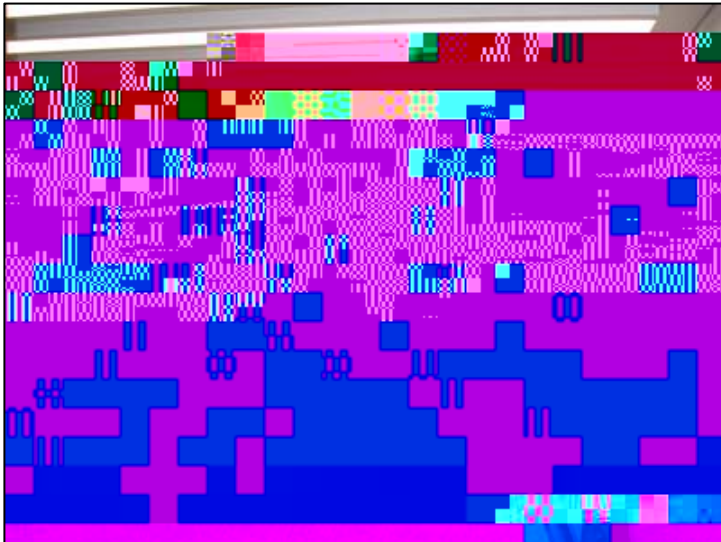
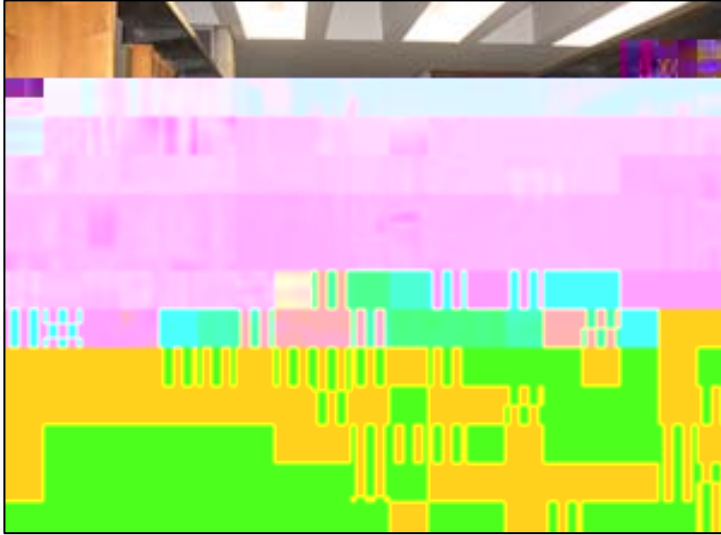

- › General updating of and refurbishing of public spaces, reading rooms, and study rooms



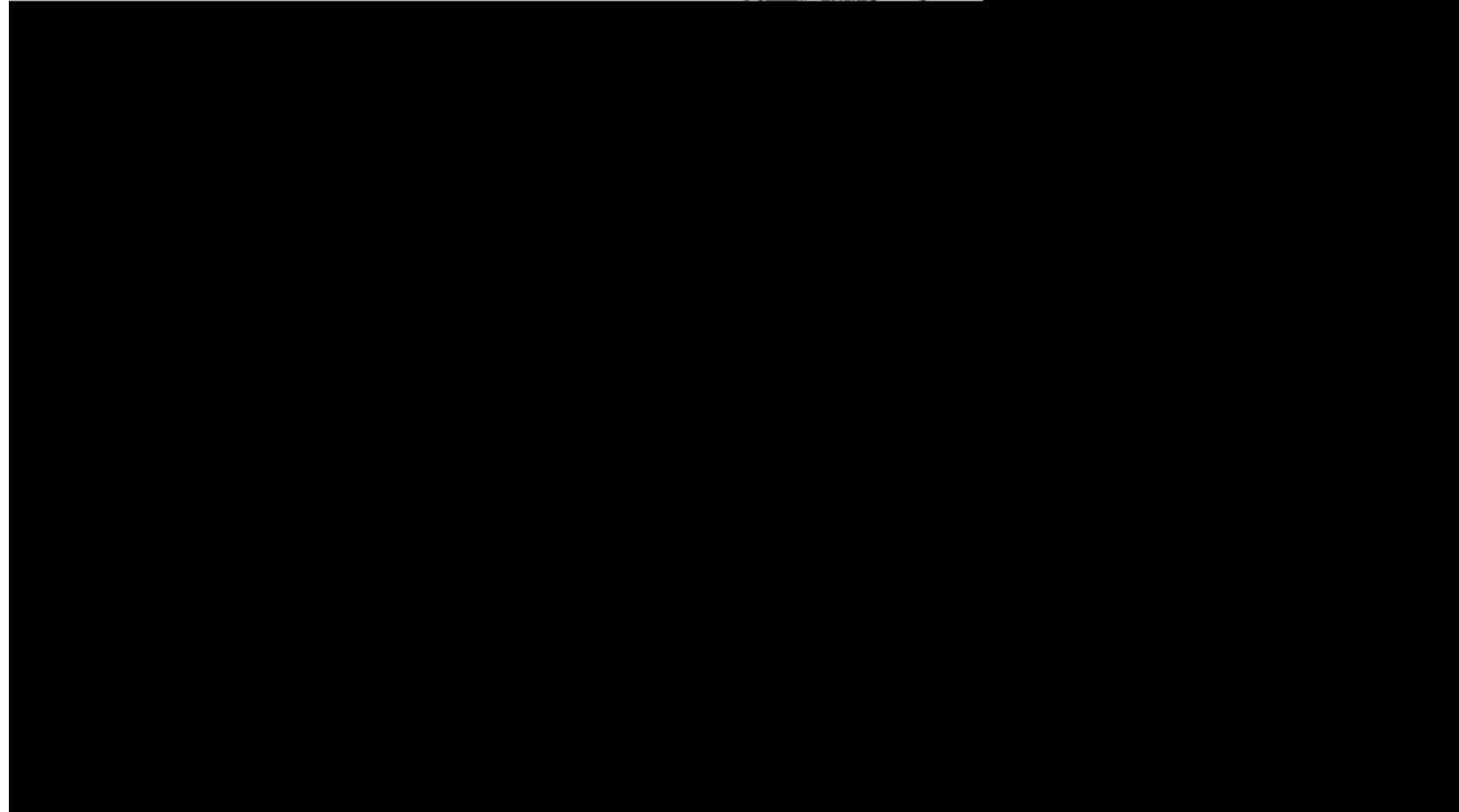
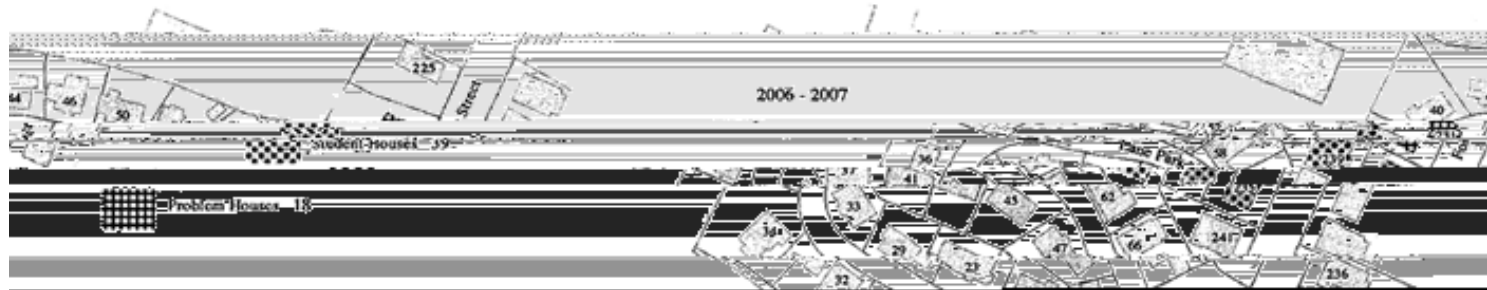

Amendments to Current Master Plan

- ÿ **BRA Process – Amendment Filed Oct 12, 2007**
 - › Amendment necessary to meet Fall 2008 timeline for WJST relocation
 - › WJST needs to move from current site in Cambridge
 - › Program for BC School of Theology and Ministry in Bishop Peterson Hall identical to approved program in St. Williams Hall
 - › Seek approval to use Bishop Peterson Hall for BC School of Theology and Ministry Program
 - › Seek approval to use Library for shared St. John's Seminary and BC School of Theology and Ministry
- ÿ **St. William's Hall Program Change**
 - › Relocate Administrative Offices
 - › Included in Institutional Master Plan

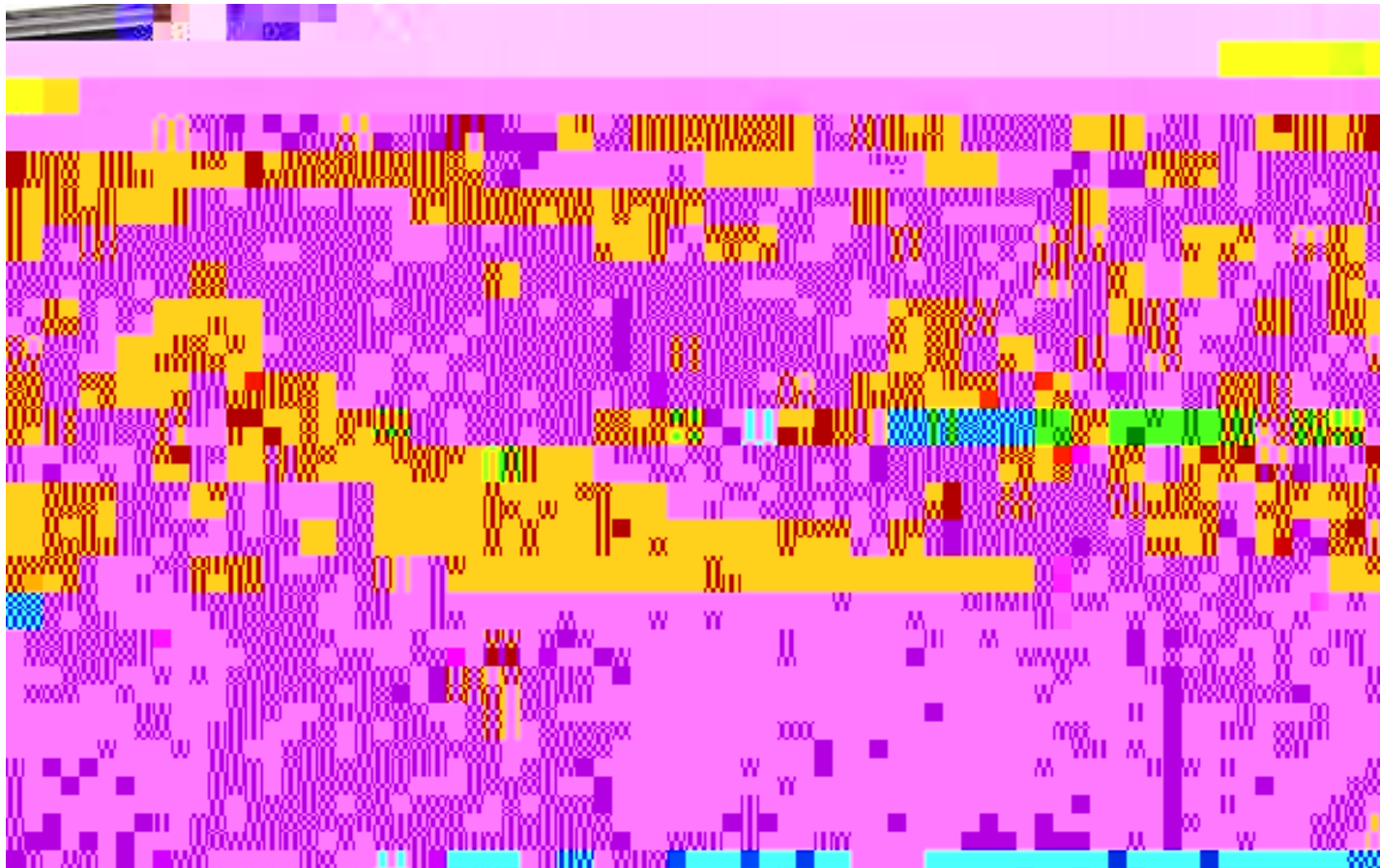

Walking Patrol Incident Summary

- ÿ 4 Houses visited more than once
- ÿ 5 Houses were Non-BC Residents



Example of a Repeat Offender

ÿ **62 + 64 Kirkwood Road**

- › Joint basement converted into “Club Kirkwood”
- › Underage drinking and excessive noise
- › Exposed wiring and egress issues
- › No smoke or carbon monoxide detectors

ÿ **Actions Taken**

- › Parties disbanded by BC & Boston Police
- › ISD inspected for code violations & BC attended code violation hearing
- › Landlord resolved violations
 - ÿ Relocated 5 students after the attics & basement were condemned as living spaces
 - ÿ Placed a divider wall in basement
 - ÿ Installed smoke & carbon monoxide detectors
 - ÿ Fixed wiring and egress issues
- › Parents met with their sons about their behavior

Allston Brighton Scholarship Program

- ÿ Provides academically talented students from Allston/Brighton the financial support to attend Boston College

- ÿ Award Eligibility:
 - › permanent resident of Allston-Brighton for a minimum of four years
 - › accepted for freshman admission at Boston College
 - › completed the Boston College financial application process and have an institutionally determined need of greater than \$10,000





Allston Brighton Scholarship Program

- ÿ If all 10 scholarships are not awarded to Allston/Brighton students, then the remaining scholarships are awarded to admitted students who reside in other neighborhoods of Boston

- ÿ This year, 3 scholarships were awarded to Boston students:
 - › Angela Caputo-Papastamos, English High School, Roslindale
 - › Ergy Jean-Baptiste, English High School, Dorchester
 - › Janet Yu, John D. O'Bryant School, Boston.
